Miss McLeod's Reel

MacLeod's Reel / Hop High Ladies (the Cake's All Dough) / Did You Ever See the Devil Uncle Joe

MISS MCLEOD'S REEL

MacLeod's Reel/Hop High Ladies (the Cake's All Dough)/Did You Ever See the Devil Uncle Joe



It is believed that Miss McLeod's Reel/MacLeod's Reel is originally from Scotland and was first printed in Nathaniel Gow's **Fifth Collection of Strathspey Reels** (1809). By 1826, the tune was printed in America in the **New and Compleat Preceptor for the Fife** by William Williams (Utica, NY). Miss McLeod's Reel also appears in Elias Howe's **Musician's Omnibus No.1** (Boston, 1862, p 44) with contradance steps: 3

First couple down the centre turn half round back (lady on gent's side, gent on lady's side) cast off ladies chain promenade 4 forward and back cross over to place

It is not clear when Did You Ever See the Devil Uncle Joe/Hop High Ladies (the Cake's All Dough)⁴ started to become popular. The lyrics that I learned from my southern parents in the 1990s and from my southern fellow fiddlers in the 2000s are below but there are many (many) other lyrics as would be expected from such a ubiquitous tune:

Verse:

Did you ever see the devil, Uncle Joe, Uncle Joe (3x) Don't mind the weather when the wind don't blow

Chorus:

Hop high ladies, three in a row (x3) or Hop high ladies for the cake's all dough (x3)

Don't mind the weather when the wind don't blow Did you ever go to meetin', 5 Uncle Joe, Uncle Joe (3x) Don't mind the weather when the wind don't blow How'd ya like the weather, Uncle Joe, Uncle Joe (3x) Don't mind the weather when the wind don't blow

- 5. *Meetin'* is short for camp meeting, which is a Protestant Christian service dating from the Second Great Awakening in the early 19th century. These were originally held outside in campgrounds because of the large turnouts and lack of large buildings on the American Frontier. You can still attend camp meetings in the southeast (and other US regions) but now they are held in large, air-conditioned buildings.

Hi Everyone

We will be having our regular monthly acoustic jam this coming Friday, April 7th from 10am-Noon at Faith Baptist Church in Chehalis. The church is located at 436 Coal Creek Rd. To find the church take I-5 to exit 79, then head East. Turn LEFT on N. National Ave and go 1/3 mile, then turn RIGHT on Coal Creek Rd. Go 1.1 mile, then turn RIGHT into the church driveway. We are usually in the middle building. There will be coffee and tea and some snacks, but it's not a potluck.

And don't forget that FiddleCamp registration will be this Monday, April 3rd and is online this year, but if you don't have a computer you can mail in your registration. FiddleCamp will be July 10-14 this year at the Moses Lake Christian academy in Moses Lake, Wa. Tuition is \$75 for youth and \$175 for adults and all classes are half day. If there is room in the class you can sign up for a second class in the opposite time slot for no extra charge.

District 9 has FiddleCamp tuition scholarships available for anyone under age 18 who is a WOTFA member and lives in the district (Lewis & Thurston Counties), give me a call or text if you would like a scholarship for FiddleCamp. All the money we raise throughout the year goes exclusively to provide youth scholarships for FiddleCamp, and I would like to see that money used to send our kids to Moses Lake if possible.

Dry camping is available at the school, there are one or two electrical hook-ups available but may or may not be available. Both the Ramada Inn and the Inn at Moses Lake are offering a \$99.99/night price for anyone there for FiddleCamp. Also, there is camping at the Grant County Fairgrounds and several RV parks in Moses Lake.

Interview with WOTFA Youth/Family Member Ruby Gunter



How and when did you get started with the violin?

When did you discover fiddling?

I was in the 5th grade and started fiddling when I started with Ms. Denice. We sought out Denice because of Suzuki, and fiddling was an extra thing we both weren't sure about it.

Did you know the violin was a fiddle?

I had a fiddle and I knew that was almost the same as a violin but it's not the instrument, it's the music. There is still a conflict for some people.

What do you like most?

The classical violin is playing for the structure and rules and has to be very proper and I can strive for a specific goal which is rewarding. I like fiddling for different reasons.

There are so many positive reasons, I really like free-flowing, having a whole lot of fun and not worrying about being too proper... and putting more of your own spins on things. I also had a really nice experience when I was fiddling with a group and it is fun to be in that community. I played guitar with my friends and to have everyone be nice and supportive... was a big part of my experience.

Have you been to fiddle contests or the WOTFA Fiddle Contest?

I have been to several including the WOTFA in 7th grade. [I've attended] Some other contests like the NW Regional Fiddle Contest, Oregon, and smaller contests.
